Graduate students can elect to add Nurse Educator courses to include NURSM 615, NURSM 703, NURSM 713 and NRPHD 800.

A minimum of 1,000 practicum hours are required to earn a DNP degree, including preceptored practicum hours earned from the MSN degree. Deficit practicum hours, if any, will be added to the residency practicum hours.

According to College Policy, all MSN/DNP students must graduate within 1.5 years times the length of the program; therefore, the part-time Post-MSN DNP plan must be completed within 3 years from the date of initial enrollment. Courses in the DNP program are offered once per year; either fall, spring, or summer semesters. Any deviation from this plan may jeopardize program completion and must be approved by the Director of MSN/DNP Programs.
